Digital Devices - Personal Chromebook/Laptop

Covid-19 has given us another reason to encourage students to have their own devices as sharing of materials is increasingly more difficult due to health regulations.


Digital Devices - Cell Phones

DIGITAL DEVICES POLICY

It is recognized that cell phones and other digital internet-capable devices may be available to some of our students. With that, such devices brought to school will be required to be locked inside the student's locker immediately when they enter the school and accessed **ONLY** after the last bell at 3:12 PM. Students will not have access, nor will they need access to their devices, throughout the day. Plans that need to be made for after school will need to be made in advance, or made using the classroom telephone with teacher permission. Any student with a device at school will be required to have a school lock on their locker. The lock must always be locked and the combination **NOT** shared. There will be no "In Locker" use of devices.

NOTE: The <u>fastest</u> method of getting a message to your child during the school day is to call the school office at 403-556-1003 then dial 2 for the office.

*Incidents will be evaluated on a case by case basis - the consequence may be determined at the discretion of the principal based on the severity of the event.

Guts, Resiliency, Integrity and Tenacity

Students need to experience success AND setback - this builds resiliency!

We do little for our kids if they leave us and do not know how to problem solve, take responsibility, or deal with unexpected trials in their lives.

Parents and teachers need to help this process by working as a **TEAM**, placing accountability with the **STUDENT**, and not 'plowing' the way to eliminate obstacles.

Classroom/Teacher Selection

TRUST THE PROCESS

Every classroom has something to offer each child. We build our class lists with many contextual factors in mind.

Please do not come to EDMS with a preconceived opinion about any one class.

Provide support, empathy and insight to your child, but new classes, new peers and new experiences are areas they need to navigate on their own.

Be patient. New experiences are LEARNING experiences.

Academic Expectations

This is differs slightly at each of our community schools, particularly as students age.

Students need to start taking more responsibility for their learning at this level with parents as a support, not as a scapegoat.

By all means, encourage, discuss and problem solve with your child, but try to place the responsibility of actions (and inaction) on them.

You will see percents AND indicators... both are EQUALLY important.

Think of yourself as a student

Percents showed your average, but not the details of your learning.

Percents are a way to understand GENERALLY, but do not speak to skills in specific areas of strength or need.

Indicators of outcomes, and teacher comments on assignments, will tell you more.

Attendance

Data shows the more regularly a student attends, the more success they will experience as a student.

We ask you please PHONE and excuse your child

IF WE DON'T HEAR FROM YOU

You will be notified via a call from the school

We ask you please call in after receiving this notification to let us know about the student absence. Your child's safety is our number one.

Discipline

- Safety is our number one priority
- This includes physical, emotional and intellectual safety for all students
- Online safety is also monitored
- Consequences are more immediate and tied to behaviour
- Suspensions for: skipping school, online and offline bullying, inappropriate behaviours (examples), physical, emotional or intellectual harassment
- Not handing in assignments, physical roughhousing, also have consequences

Weekdays 'til 6 is a new practice in Chinook's Edge which means all non-emergency emails and texts will only be sent prior to 6:00 p.m. on weekdays. **Weekdays 'til 6 is about honouring your personal time as parents, families, students and staff**. Our hope is that everyone in our Chinook's Edge school communities enjoys a healthy work/life balance which involves evenings spent with family and friends, time participating in volunteer efforts and other activities you value, and looking after your health through physical activity, hobbies, rest and reading!

Chinook's Edge strives to ensure our staff are ready to deliver their very best to our students each day! We realize that their demanding roles in education requires many of our staff to continue to work in the evenings, as they plan and prepare for the next day. However, **Weekdays 'til 6 ensures this evening work does not include emails and texts which, like any business, will be responded to during business hours.**

We recognize that evenings are often the best time for teachers and parents to reach one another, and we know that in many cases teachers will continue to phone parents as they have done in the past. Weekdays 'til 6 relates only to emails and texts. Our teachers and staff will continue to be working in the evenings if required, but they will be sending and responding to emails and texts only before 6:00 p.m. in most cases. We are asking parents to support a next school-day response to non-emergency emails and texts.
